

## The Japan Convention Bureau announces the winners of the JAPAN Best Incentive Travel Awards 2019

The Japan Convention Bureau, a division within the Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO) recognizes best practice in incentive travel to Japan through the "JAPAN Best Incentive Travel Awards". The fourth edition of the contest accepted applications from June 18 to August 2, 2019. There were a total of 68 applications from 13 countries and regions.

The winners of the "Best Incentive Travel", "Best Creative Planning" and "Best Community Contribution" categories are announced as per below. The Awards ceremony will take place for the first time in Osaka, at the historical Osaka City Central Public Hall – designated cultural asset of national importance - on October 23, 2019.

This year, a Special Recognition has been given to incentive travels which visited Hokkaido and Fukushima, in gratitude to their support of the recovery of these areas, affected by earthquakes in recent years.
